The Way To Deschapelles


More and more people are making the long, arduous journey from Port-au-Prince through the Artibonite Valley to our workshop in Deschapelles.

A workshop in PaP that was destroyed by the earthquake is to be rebuilt to counteract the rural exodus.





Operative Results 2010 - 2012








