The medi for help workshop and the Albert Schweitzer Hospital have changed the living conditions of the people in the valley.

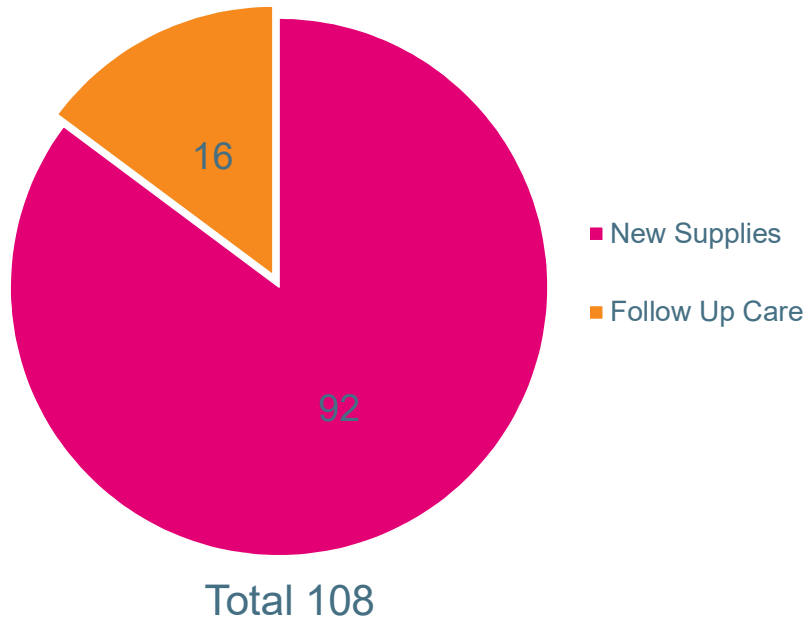
We call our way of working together in Haiti “Together at eye level with respect, humility, determination, humor and love” - it takes all five (!) - and it has been our model of success for many years!

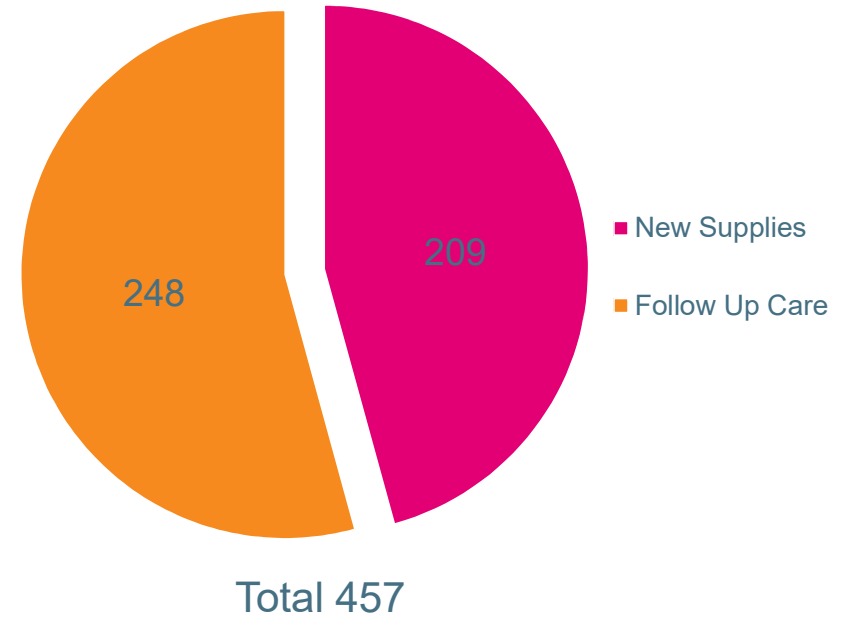

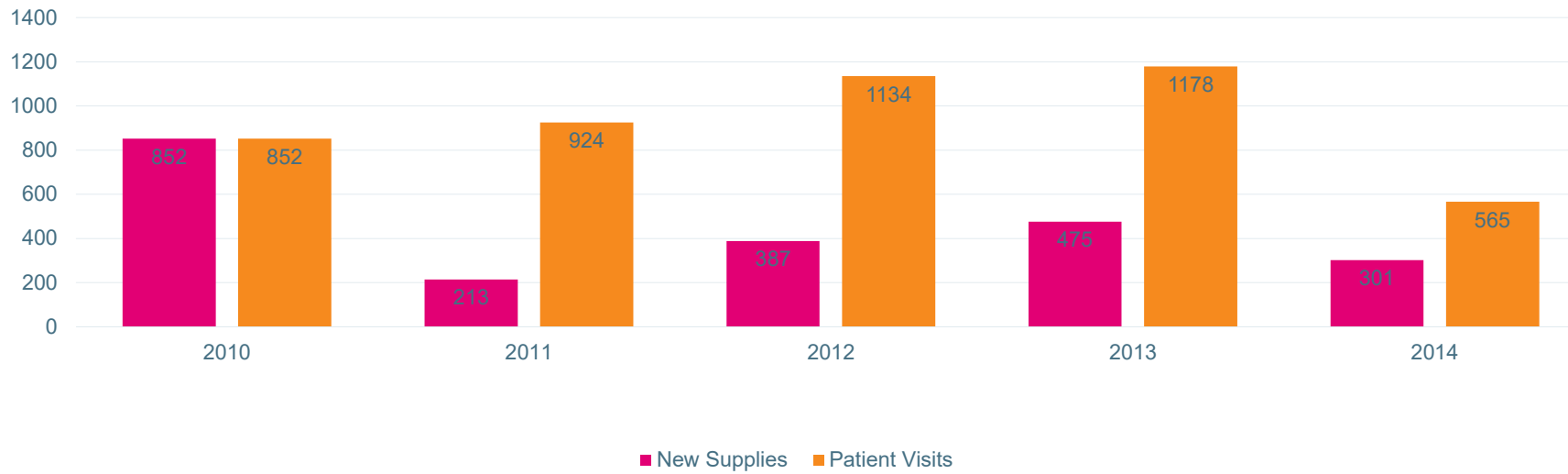
Prosthetics

Expansion of on-site help with compression supplies

The Bernard Mevs Wound Clinic in PaP and the Leogane lymphatic clinic in St. Croix Hospital are supported by medi for help USA in the area of compression with (circaid® and mediven®).

By recruiting and sending wound experts, 488 patients were treated this year.

medi for help USA & International Lymphedema and Wound Training Institute ILWTI

The Nova Southeastern University NSU Haiti initiative “Bring Hope to Haiti” aims to eradicate lymphatic filariasis by 2020 in Haiti.

Lymphatic filariasis is an infestation of parasites that is spread by mosquitoes.

The roundworms live in the lymph vessels and lymph nodes, which over time causes impairment of the lymph flow and blockages of the lymph vessels and lymphedema.

88% of Haiti are in the danger zone for lymphatic filariasis.

There are seven stages here: from minimal / reversible edema to massive elephantiasis.

The subsidy from “medi for help USA” enables immediate care for patients suffering from lymphatic filariasis.

medi for help USA & International Lymphedema and Wound Training Institute ILWTI

medi for help USA has confirmed a donation of \$ 15,000.

This grant enabled the ILWTI to open the clinic immediately.

In addition, the remuneration for the senior physicians in charge, two technicians, administrative patient coordinators, local supervisory doctors and commissioning costs for the outpatient department in the form of computers (2), a printer, telephones and portable massage treatment tables (3) were supported for four months.

medi for help USA & Morris Vein Institut

Amigos de Salud Inc. is a non-profit, voluntary, medical organization that enables its members to collect medical equipment as well as supplies and supplies.

It also makes it possible to travel to developing countries to treat several thousand patients and perform hundreds of diagnostic treatments and surgical interventions.

Donations in the form of medical services, equipment, supplies, medications and financial resources are essential.

In addition, volunteers provide medical care in a clinic in Nicaragua.

medi for help USA approved the grant in the form of a product donation.

medi for help USA & Intermountain Vein Clinic

The Hackett Hemwall Foundation has clinics in three cities in Honduras: LaCeiba, Tela and Olanchito.

The three cities are metropolitan areas.

The patients also come from many places and villages in the surrounding rural regions.

Some of the patients arrive by walking for hours and taking the public bus.

The Hackett Hemwall Foundation is also organizing a group of dedicated doctors, nurses and assistants who travel to Honduras on a work and educational trip. ”

There I Stood - Haiti is committed to providing education and employment opportunities for people in Haiti.

This year, the nonprofit helped eight families with one parent who was in a wheelchair send their children to school.
