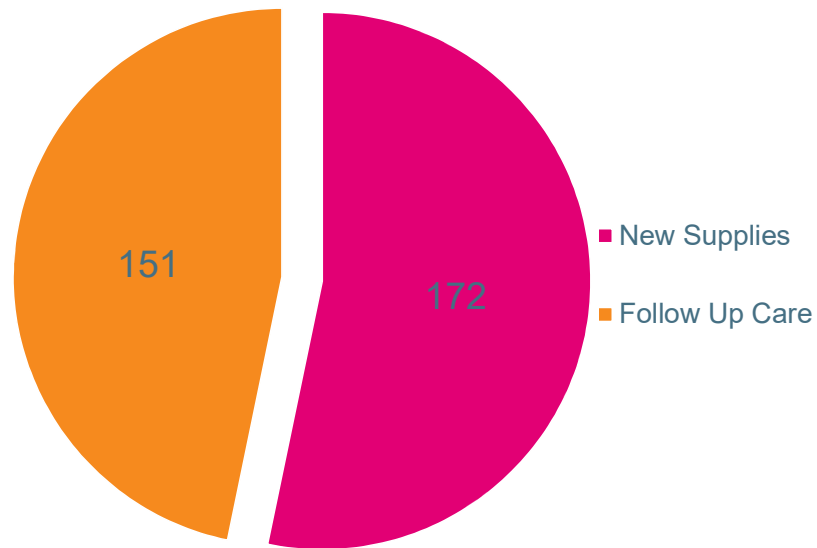

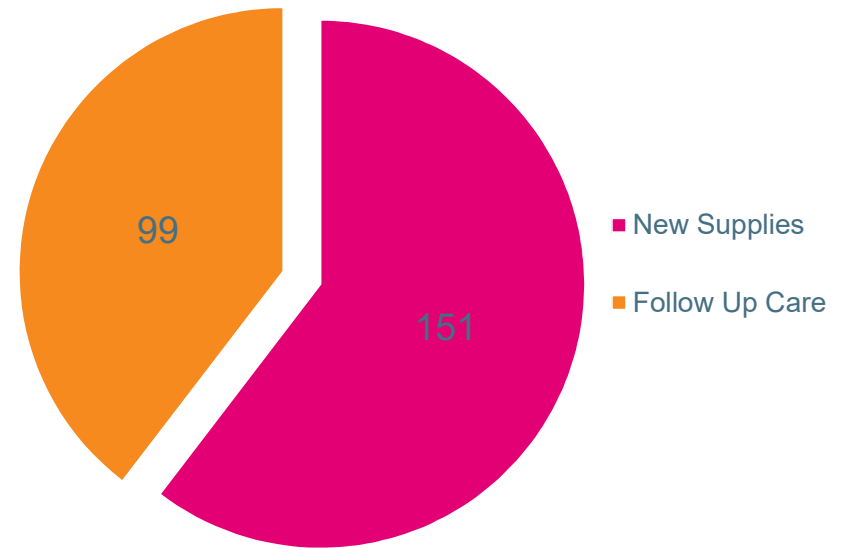

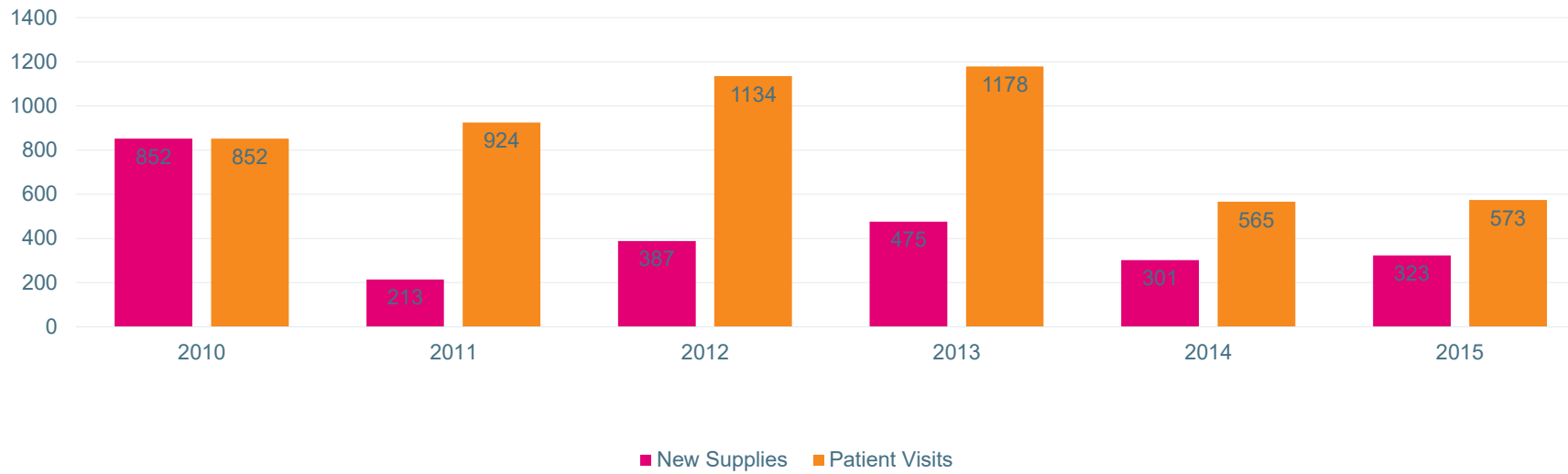

In 2015, medi for help USA collected more than 7,000 US dollars in donations, which will be used to further support the main initiative - development of the lymphatic clinic at St. Croix Hospital in Leogone Haiti.

Hackett Hemwall Foundation, LaCeiba, Tela and Olanchito Honduras - Treatment of venous and lymphatic patients
