medi for help is expanding its commitment

The corona pandemic, political unrest and a natural disaster made it impossible to visit our projects on site in 2021. Nevertheless, we are looking to the future in a targeted manner: We are expanding our commitment with a second project and a new focus. Here, too, the aim is to give more hope to as many socially disadvantaged people as possible without access to medical care and to improve their quality of life.



Therapy focus: from prosthetics to lymphology

medi for help is built on the core competencies of the medical aids manufacturer medi: practical and scientific experience, a strong network and a comprehensive product portfolio.

The initial focus of prosthetic care has already shifted in recent years to support in lymphology, a field in which we continuously saw the need - this was also our treatment competence in 2021.

In addition to the therapy of lymphatic diseases due to organic causes, the focus is on the treatment of "lymphatic filariasis". We also treat patients with orthopedic diseases.

New project with the IAD in India - Insights

The non-profit research center Institute of Applied Dermatology (IAD) focuses on the therapy of lymphatic diseases, in particular on the treatment of the neglected, poverty-related tropical disease "lymphatic filariasis", a disease of the lymphatic system caused by parasites.¹

New project with the IAD in India - Insights

Around 250 patients are treated annually at the IAD, 30 percent of them are emergency patients.

Therapy: The integrative, holistic treatment approach combines bandaging, yoga and Ayurveda. Also, self-management workshops with patients from villages across India are offered by the IAD.


What is special: 75% of paying patients enable socially disadvantaged patients who cannot afford treatment themselves to be treated free of charge.

New project with the IAD in India - first steps together

The IAD was also hit hard by the corona pandemic – a serious economic losses was one of the consequences. Through e.g. the closure of the clinic on weekends, wages were lost for the highly qualified employees.

medi for help – together with individual donors – provided financial support and was able to secure the employees' monthly salary payments. This had a positive effect on the care: In 2021, 85 patients could be treated free of charge in the IAD.

New project with the IAD in India - first steps together

In the summer of 2021, indication-specific compression systems from medi were sent to Kasaragod (India) for the treatment of lymphatic diseases.

"Our principle of 'helping people to help themselves' also includes support from our many years of specialist expertise. As the application of the specific compression products must be learned, we usually have trained the medical staff on site for optimal patient care. Due to the pandemic, the training took place digitally in online training courses over several days. We were still able to explain how to use the compression products step by step," says Christopher Miles, Director Clinical Education, medi USA.



Due to the current corona pandemic, the product training took place exclusively digitally. The training, which lasted several days, was provided by the medi subsidiary in the USA.



Cooperation with the Hôpital Albert Schweitzer (HAS) in Haiti: current situation

In addition to the ongoing political unrest and the assassination of the President in early July 2021, Haiti continues to struggle with severe natural disasters. In August 2021, a 7.2 magnitude earthquake struck the south-west of the country, killing over 2,200 people, seriously injuring more than 12,600 Haitians and leaving thousands homeless.

Cooperation with the HAS in Haiti: current situation

The situation in Haiti is getting worse: over 800 kidnappings and more than 50 percent of the capital Port-au-Prince are under the control of armed gangs. The areas around the ports are also affected, which means that deliveries are no longer possible. For example, tank trucks could not drive to the areas, with the result that gas stations had to be closed and mobility was restricted as a result. The political unrest has an impact on all social life: schools, shops and hospitals also closed.





Cooperation with the HAS in Haiti: Corona pandemic


Haiti also continues to struggle with the corona pandemic and rising numbers - it is one of the last countries to be equipped with the vaccine Moderna through international aid. The first vaccination campaign from September to October 2021 was a success: 7,449 doses were delivered in 23 days.




HAS Haiti: Operative Results 2021



A total of 246 patients were treated in 2021. The focus was on orthotic care.






HAS Haiti: Operative Results 2010 - 2021
